Money Doesn't Grow on Trees - or Copy on New Photocopiers

You probably know that high quality, low cost digital scanning, copying and printing technologies have been used to counterfeit currency, but did you know that the government is fighting back? When you put a document under the glass of your new photocopier or scanner and push the button, it dutifully makes a high resolution copy - unless the document is one of the new style twenty or fifty dollar bills. If you do that, you just might be surprised to see a message pop up informing you that you should visit this website to become more educated on counterfeit laws: http://www.winxpnews.com/rd/rd.cfm? id=041005ED-Rules

At the site, you'll find all sorts of interesting information about restrictions on photographing or otherwise reproducing currency in the particular country you choose. For example, reproductions of U.S. money must be either much smaller (less than 3/4 the size of the original) or much larger (more than one and 1/2times the original) and cannot be double sided. It's actually an interesting site, but it could be a little unnerving to have your printer or copier send you there. You probably never considered that the machine could know what it was copying. And of course, if it's that smart, you might wonder what else it can do. If your computer is Internet-connected (as most are these days), will it send a message to the Treasury Department to report that you're trying to illegally copy money?

According to the consortium that commissioned the development of the technology (which consists of banks in the U.S., Japan, Canada and Europe), it doesn't have that capability - at least, not yet. And not all printers and copiers use the technology. Older models don't, and no one is sure how many manufacturers are building it into their new products although it's known that Kodak, Ulead and Hewlett-Packard are). It's not mandatory - again, not yet. There is a proposal under consideration by the EU to force companies that make printers and scanners to include it in their products.



It's not just hardware vendors that are incorporating the technology, either. Adobe and other vendors who make graphics manipulation programs are adding the technology to their software. This means you can't open image files that contain pictures of protected currency in PhotoShop. Another thing no one is sure of is how the technology works. We just know that there is something in the new colorful U.S. bills (and some Euro denominations) that triggers it.

The anti-counterfeiting technology was created by Digimarc for the Central Bank Counterfeit Deterrence Group, which was formed in the early 90's to address the counterfeiting problem. Now many computer users are up in arms about the fact that their software and hardware can control what images they can copy or open. And it does open up some interesting possibilities. We have no interest in counterfeiting money, but can the same technology be used to keep you from copying other material that's deemed "inappropriate," or from opening images that are considered to be "bad?" Since its creators are so secretive about how the technology works, we don't know.

What do you think? Is this a great new use of technology that can deter a criminal act far more effectively than mere legislation could do? Or is it opening up a dangerous door that would allow hardware and software companies (and the government, through mandates to those companies) to control everything that we can or can't copy or view? How to Reinstall Internet Explorer 6

If you're having serious problems with IE, one way to repair it is to run the Windows XP installation CD to repair Windows. But what if you don't have your copy of the installation CD on hand? There's another way: you can just reinstall IE 6, but first you need to edit the Registry so Windows will think IE isn't installed. Here's how:

- 1. Open your favorite Registry Editor.
- Navigate to the following registry key: HKEY LO-CAL MACHINE\SOFTWARE\Microsoft\Active Setup\Installed Components\{89820200-ECBD-11cf-8B85-00AA005B4383}
- 3. Right click the value labeled IsInstalled and select Modify.
- 4. Change the data value setting from 1 to 0.
- 5. Close the Registry Editor.
