

Genealogy 101

Genealogy—is the study and tracing of <u>family pedi-</u> <u>grees</u>. This involves collecting the names of relatives, both living and deceased, and establishing the relationships between them based on primary, secondary and/or <u>circumstantial evidence</u> or <u>documentation</u>, thus building up a cohesive <u>family tree</u>. Genealogy is sometimes also referred to as family history, although sometimes these terms are used distinctly: the former being the basic study of who is related to whom; the latter involving more "fleshing out" of the life histories of the individuals involved.


Genealogy beginners can learn how to utilize the internet to do genealogy research to find family surnames and ancestors using both free genealogy resources and subscription sites, as well as the many other resources that can be adapted for genealogy research.

Most genealogical software programs have a place to record your source notes and your research notes. Source notes contain bibliographical information about individual records and research notes are useful to keep track of the information you found in each record.



The key to good source documentation is to provide enough information so the document can be located by you or by someone else.

Discovering your family's past can be a thrilling journey into unknown territory. **Ancestory.com** is the top-of-theline when it comes to genealogy service and software. When exploring your roots at Ancestory.com, you'll also



be able to learn more about your family's place in history, share of discoveries with other family members, motivate other to begin their family history and connect with your relatives from all over the world. You'll have access to Historical

Newspapers, U.S. Collections, U.S. Immigrations collections, U.S. Census Images and Indexes, and U.K. & Ireland Records Collections. It can get pricy, but if you've serious about the task at hand, this is the best service out there.

Genealogy.com is home to the #1-selling Family Tree Maker Software. All you need to do is follow step-by-step guides to help you bbuild, preserve, and share your family story. The say you can create heirloom-quality family trees, family books, and reports with the click of a button but it does take a little emore effort than that. However, their state-of-the-art searching technology makes building your tree fast and easy. You'll be able to get a prioritized list of leads that may help you track down missing ancestors.
