Rick Piotrowski started and gave an overview of Ooma which costs \$179. It includes a 8"x6" box which replaces your present phone system. There are no

addition monthly fees. However, you will be charged taxes which run between \$5 and \$9. Ooma has much more than Skype. There is no charge for calls overseas. However, both the caller and the receiver must have Ooma. International high speed internet is needed. You can port your current number for a fee. 911 calls are included. It includes all phones in the house

All computers come with a 90 day warranty. PC's for back to school include laptops, netbooks, etc by Hewlett Packard, Dell Acer and others

Online is different from the store, although you can return online products at the store.

Costco has a concierge service which is in Ft. Mays which gives personal service. There is a separate 800 number for computer and TV services. Usually you will get a service person in the US, if your call is from the US.

There is a 2 year warranty on computers and TV's. You can get an extra 3 years with a purchase of an under 30" TV. However, the repair might not be done on the premises.

The call centers are manned 17 hours per day 7 days a week.

If you are in the store and see a price with a *, it means that the product is being continued.

Rohn took over to explain the membership. There are coupons monthly. Costco includes: mortgage services, travel services, passport photos, eyeglasses, prescriptions, and hearing aides. There is about a 12% to `14% markup of their prices.

Costco is rated #1 by Consumer Reports. Sam's is #8.

The base membership is \$55. The executive membership is \$110 and you get money back. It includes an American Express card.

There is no trial membership; however your membership can be refunded, if you are dissatisfied. You can split a membership between two families even if there live at separated locations. If a product goes on sale a couple of weeks after you buy an item, bring the receipt to the store and you will be given the difference. You can also get your pet medications from the Costco Pharmacy.

If you joined that afternoon, you received a Costco card with \$10 on it to use the next time you shopped.
